I. SCOPE

This policy applies to students who seek admission to Delaware Technical Community College while concurrently enrolled in high school.

II. POLICY STATEMENT

Delaware Tech offers a number of programs for high school students as well as ways to earn credit to help high school students get a head start on college. Students who qualify may take college-level courses and earn credit toward their high school graduation and a college degree. The proposed update is to eliminate the requirement that students be “rising juniors and seniors” to participate in courses at Delaware Tech. It also clarifies “early admissions” and “early enrollment” to bring it together under one header with more concise language.

III. POLICY

The following will be substituted in lieu of the existing policy.

High School Students Early Admissions and Enrollment Programs

High school students may concurrently enroll at Delaware Tech prior to high school graduation. Students need to obtain parent/guardian approval before enrolling.

Students must meet course pre-requisites for enrollment. Students must register for the Delaware Tech course(s) and pay tuition and appropriate fees. Students must satisfy program-specific requirements applicable to each selected college course.

High school students may enroll at Delaware Tech on a full or part-time basis. There is no limit on how many credits a student can take. Specific programs, including over-subscribed programs, may be exempt from this policy.

Early Admissions

A rising senior high school student can be admitted and enroll in a degree or diploma program at Delaware Tech on a full or part-time basis.


IV. EFFECTIVE DATE(S)
